




The Cape Peninsula



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## **DETAILED ITINERARY**





This site is a World Heritage Site, and protected Nature Reserve is an area of vast natural beauty, world renown for it natural vegetation and rich bio-diversity.

NB: The Cape of Good Hope is mistakenly thought of as the southernmost point of Africa and the spot where the Atlantic and Indian Oceans meet. The true southernmost point of Africa is at Cape Agulhas, located on the Garden Route of South Africa over 200 km away. The Cape of Good Hope is actually the most south-western tip of South Africa.

Bartholomeu Dias, the Portuguese seafarer, was the first European to sail around the Cape in 1488. On his return voyage, he stopped at the south-western tip of South Africa, and named it Cabo Tormentoso, (Cape of Storms). King John of Portugal later gave it the name Cabo da Boa Esperança (Cape of Good Hope).

	Kirstenbosch Botanical Gardens Regarded as one of the great botanic gardens of the world, Kirstenbosch was bequeathed to the government by Cecil John Rhodes. At the time, it was nothing more than ramshackle farmland overrun with pigs. In 1913 a botanist called Harold Pearson set about transforming the land into a botanic garden devoted to the country's indigenous flora. It now contains over 7000 species of plants from southern Africa. The 528-hectare Kirstenbosch Estate (which includes the Garden) falls under the Cape Floristic Region, which is a UNESCO World Heritage Site.
